The US Citizenship Honors Dinner returned!!

After COVID forced us to cancel in 2021, the QCAIR Citizenship Honors Dinner returned in force on November 6, 2021. Held at the Spotlight Event Center, 1800 7th Avenue in Moline, the dinner coincided with an open house for our offices in the same building. In keeping with the event's spirit, we featured four new Americans who shared their journey to becoming US citizens and QuadCitizens.

The first speaker was Enrique Rodrigues Hernandez, who came to the US as an asylum seeker from Cuba. The asylum process is not easy. While pursuing citizenship, he built a career at Costco, starting with a temporary, seasonal position at Costco and working hard to get subsequent promotions - leading to his current position as the store manager at the Davenport Costco. His inspiring story was followed by Weihua Hu, who arrived in the US at

with her family in 2002, at the age of 12. She shared a funny tale of how her first impression of the US was of the cornfields she saw flying from Chicago to the Quad Cities, which did nfit with what she knew of the US from tv and movies. A graduate of the University of Iowa, Weihua aspires to work in Human Resources, preferably at Green State Credit Union, her current place of employment.

Maryia Sukhotskaya shared a story different from the others, coming to the US as a green card winner. Maryia was born in Belarus and educated in both Belarus and Poland. She did a work-study in the US during college in the northeast, but during a visit to Chicago, she fell in love with the city. She won her green card in the lottery and arrived in the US in 2009, settling in Chicago. She became a citizen in 2015 and moved to the Quad Cities with her partner in 2020, working at HNI in Muscatine. The last speaker, Redeem Toko, shared the stage with her husband, John. They have recently opened a food store, "Mawua Food Market," on Locust Street in Davenport. Her journey was a little quicker than most because she followed her husband, who had previously immigrated to the US through the green card program. Redeem demonstrated ambition and a strong work ethic opening a business!

Attending the dinner was an incredible experience, combined with inspiring stories, a diverse assortment of international cuisines from local minority and immigrant-owned restaurants, capped off with a successful silent auction of items donated by Quad Cities businesses. The night made me proud to be the Director of QCAIR, and I am already looking forward to next year's US Citizenship Honors Dinner.
